

The Declaration of Independence by Humanity.



God the Creator created humanity in His image at the beginning. God formed Adam from adama (earth) and breathed His Spirit into him.

The purpose of God's creation was and is, from the beginning, as follows:

Humanity is to make the earth a colony of the Kingdom of God as a representative and ambassador of Heaven.

God is the King over the entire created universe, both over the earth and the universe—the visible physical realm—and over Heaven, the invisible spiritual realm. God’s form of government is a kingdom, with Him as the King to whom all creation belongs. He is also the origin and the source.

Everyone who believes in the existence of God will agree that God reigns in Heaven.

What about the earth? God has delegated dominion over the earth to humanity.

Genesis 1:26.

Adam, the first human, is called a son of God. Luke 3:38.

Thus, God the King created human children and entrusted them with dominion over the earth, with the intention of making the earth a colony of the Kingdom of Heaven and spreading the culture and glory of God’s Kingdom on earth.

This went well for a short time. Humanity was in regular fellowship with its Creator. God “walked with Adam and Eve in the cool of the evening in the Garden of Eden.” This was an unblemished

fellowship, bringing joy to the Father and King; He could delight in His human children who represented Him on earth.

Adam and Eve were constantly connected to God in their spirit.

The loyalty of God's human children still needed to be tested.

Since man was made in God's image as body, soul, and spirit, they also had free will. To fully trust humanity and their voluntary loyalty, this loyalty had to be tested.

To this end, God placed **two trees in the center of the garden:**

the Tree of Life and the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil.

The fact that these two trees were placed in the center of the garden signifies that they represent two important, central divine intentions and principles.

The Tree of Life signifies that humanity needed divine eternal life, the divine nature, to authentically represent God. And God offered

Himself to humanity as the source of life and true enjoyment.

The Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil signifies becoming independent from God.

God expressly permitted man to eat from all trees, including the Tree of Life, but not from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. God warned the first humans that they would die if they ate from it.

**Thus, in the center of the Garden of Eden,
there were
two temptations, two provocations
to a decision of free will:**

either to enjoy God as the true source of life and delight,

or to rebel against God and become independent from Him.

Was it cruel of God, as some claim, to place the deadly option in the center? No, rather, this clarifies an important philosophical question: that of free will. Only in this way could free will prove itself as free will, by having a choice. God the King desires only those who are

wholeheartedly voluntary in His kingdom and royal family! The King seeks a worthy counterpart in humanity, a worthy image. Humanity is to voluntarily submit to Him, love God the King, serve Him, and represent His interests on earth.

The drama of human history begins: The Declaration of Independence.

This unblemished joy did not last long. Before Adam and Eve bore children, satan, one of the highest servants (angels) of God the King, who had fallen, appeared. He lost his high position, office, and function due to pride and rebellion and looked with envy at humanity and the dominion over the earth's territory entrusted to them. In the form of a serpent, he deceived Eve and Adam. He proceeded in a classic manner, twisting God's Word, questioning God's honest love and intention, and portraying the good King as a tyrant who withholds good things from His children. Thus, he sowed distrust.

Humanity fell, deceived by the serpent, and chose the temptation “to know everything and become like God” without depending on Him.

I recommend reading Genesis chapters 1–3 thoroughly and repeatedly, which address the creation of humanity, the Garden of Eden, and the Fall. I will quote a few verses here.

The words of Genesis carry immense supernatural power and form the foundation of human civilization.

Genesis 2:7–9:

“7 Then the LORD God formed the man of dust from the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living soul. 8 And the LORD God planted a garden in Eden, in the east, and there He put the man whom He had formed. 9 And out of the ground the LORD God made to spring up every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food. The Tree of Life was in the midst of the garden, and the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil.”

Genesis 2:15–17, 25:

“The LORD God took the man and put him in the

Garden of Eden to work it and keep it. 16 And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, 'You may surely eat of every tree of the garden, 17 but of the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die.' ... 25 And the man and his wife were both naked and were not ashamed."

The Fall:

Genesis 3:1-15:

"1 Now the serpent was more crafty than any other beast of the field that the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, 'Did God actually say, "You shall not eat of any tree in the garden"?'"

This is a distortion and false statement intended to draw Eve into a conversation.

"2 And the woman said to the serpent, "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden, 3 but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the midst of the garden, neither shall you touch it, lest you die.'"

Eve quotes God's Word inaccurately and does not mention the Tree of Life in the midst of the

garden, only the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. Wrong focus, wrong priority, wrong assessment of the tremendous gift of the Tree of Life. She also fails to mention that they were allowed to **eat freely** from **all** trees (Genesis 2:16), including the Tree of Life, except the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil.

4 But the serpent said to the woman, "You will not surely die!"

Why should Eve believe the serpent more than God?

"5 For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil."

satan portrays God in a negative light, as if He were withholding something from humanity. He promises something that is not true. They were already like God, as they were made in God's image. He sells Eve something she already is, but wrapped in a lie. For the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil is something only God can "eat" without being corrupted by evil. This was the distinction between Creator and

creature, so that the God-humans Adam and Eve would not become prideful. By eating from it, they lost their divine status and connection—a complete lie of satan.

6 When the woman saw that the tree was good to eat, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise,

Eve shifts her focus to the visible rather than the spirit, falling for the lie that it was “good to eat,” losing herself in “a delight to the eyes” and the lie that it was “desirable because it makes one wise.”

She took of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband who was with her, and he ate.

Adam should not have listened to his wife but should have trusted and obeyed God’s Word.

Consequences of the Fall:

7 Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked. And they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves loincloths.

This opening of the eyes occurred because the

connection to the Spirit of God was broken, and the center of their personality shifted to their outward senses. Shame is a consequence of the Fall and indicates that, as fallen humans, we are overly exposed to sexual impulses, which we can barely control, requiring modest clothing.

*8 And they heard the voice of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. 9 But the LORD God called to the man and said to him, "Where are you?" 10 And he said, "I heard your voice in the garden, and I was afraid, because I am naked, and I hid myself." 11 He said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten of the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?" 12 The man said, "The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit of the tree, and I ate." 13 Then the LORD God said to the woman, "What is this that you have done?" The woman said, "**The serpent deceived me, and I ate.**" 14 The LORD God said to the serpent, "Because you have done this, cursed are*

you above all livestock and above all beasts of the field! On your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat all the days of your life.”

Man, Adam, was made from “dust.”
(Genesis 2:7)

The Protoevangelium:

3,15 “And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel.” (Quotes translated from the German edition)

I will address the Protoevangelium later in detail. Be sure to read the entire chapter in the Bible to see what God said to the woman and to Adam.

This was the declaration of independence and rebellion of man against their King, God, the Creator of the universe.

It has been called the Fall.

Sin = Rebellion.

The Consequences of Man's Independence:

For man, this meant:

- Immediate spiritual death = separation from God as the source of life.
- Separation from the spiritual realm.
- Loss of dominion over the earth to satan, as man listened to him.
- Enslavement of man to satan.
- Loss of the ideal living conditions of paradise.
- Curse of the toil of labor and childbirth pains.
- Cursed ground, thorns.
- Transience and physical death.
- Fear of death, guilty conscience.

Man became independent from his God, his King, and **now thinks he can do whatever he wants, but in doing so, he became a slave to sin and the power of darkness.**

For God, the declaration of independence of man meant:

- God completely lost His human children at the very beginning.
- God lost His human-administered territory, the earth, to satan.

In His omnipotence, God could destroy satan at any time, but because He delegated the earth to man, He will not do so without man's involvement. **(Almost) everything God does on earth requires humans who give Him the legitimacy to intervene.**

The situation after the Fall was precarious. God's love is expressed in that He did not end humanity but desires to rescue His lost human children from their misery and bring them back into His kingdom. God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. However, those who reject this salvation remain under the judgment and wrath of the King.

Measures to Restore

the Original Divine Intention:

The earth is to be a human-administered colony of His kingdom.

After the Fall, God held the serpent, Eve, and Adam accountable.

Then He condemned the serpent to crawl on its belly and eat dust.

Man (Adam), made from the dust (aphar) of the earth (adama), became the sole food (source of power) for satan.

For this reason, humans and children have been and continue to be brutally sacrificed and mutilated in occult satanic rituals and dark idolatrous cults, which also include all vaccinations and abortion.

satan, however, unknowingly fell into a trap through this usurpation of man's territory.

Without man as a hostage and source of sustenance, he is powerless and starves.

The prince of this fallen world thus constantly needs power-hungry human servants of

wickedness and rebellion to maintain his corrupt world system.

The Protoevangelium (Protogospel)

Then, before Adam, Eve, and the serpent, God proclaimed the Protoevangelium, Genesis 3:15, saying to the serpent: “I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel.” (Quotes translated from the German edition)

The offspring of the serpent are all descendants of the fallen Adam who trivialize, tolerate, or promote sin, reject the Redeemer, and do not seek atonement and forgiveness through God.

The woman has no seed. This highly unusual, uniquely used expression “the seed of the woman” signifies that a virgin, without the involvement of a man, will give birth to a child conceived by God’s Spirit. And this “seed of the woman” will crush the serpent’s head, though the serpent will strike his heel.

This is the first very precise and clear promise among hundreds of fulfilled promises in the Bible concerning the Savior-King, the Messiah Jesus, the Son of God.

The first humans were highly intelligent and understood the meaning of this Protoevangelium, immortalizing it in the original constellation of the Virgin Erua: A Redeemer from God will be born as a human from a virgin and restore the lost dominion. Traces of this Protoevangelium are found globally in all cultures, especially the motif of the virgin and the child. However, this was often perverted into idolatrous cults.

This promised Messiah-Redeemer had to restore four main things:

- 1) As a human loyal and obedient to the King in Heaven, He would reclaim the lost territory of the earth for God's Kingdom, destroy the power of the serpent, and take back dominion over the earth.

- 2) Man had to be reconciled with God; for the forgiveness of sins, blood had to be shed (you shall bruise his heel).
- 3) The rebellious nature of satan had entered Adam. The Messiah had to redeem fallen humanity from its sinful, rebellious nature, without Himself being part of that fallen nature (seed of the woman), and He had to create a new humanity. He did this radically, as we will see later.
- 4) The universal romance: The Bride of the Messiah, the King.

God created man as male and female. This indicates that God desires humanity corporately as His bride. This is the universal romance between the Son of God, King Jesus, and those who believed in Him as the Messiah in anticipation, and those who now believe, follow Him, and live for His Kingdom.

Then the Messiah finally came into the world.

From the book of Genesis to the end of the Old

Testament, we see God's effort to find people who trusted in Him and believed in the promise of the Messiah. Through individuals like Abraham, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, David, Elijah, and other prophets who trusted in God (though not without flaws), God prepared an environment where the Messiah could ultimately be born. God's law was given as protection, not as harassment. To this end, He chose the people of Israel (the descendants of Jacob), a stubborn nation, and after many setbacks, a remnant of this nation under Roman occupation was finally ready for the Messiah's birth, approximately 4,000 years after the Fall. The brutal human-sacrifice idolatrous cults had been eradicated from Israel after centuries of struggle.

Jesus was likely born in September 4 BC in Bethlehem to the virgin Mary, as prophesied by the prophets Isaiah and Micah. Followers of Zoroaster (so-called Magi) saw a supernova in the east (modern-day Iraq or Iran) just above the horizon, in the direction of Judea (Israel), in

the womb of the then-constellation of the Virgin Erua. (Erua means in Sumerian cuneiform: “The one who will bear the seed promised in the Garden of Eden.” See Werner Papke: Das Zeichen des Messias.) Zoroaster himself was a contemporary of the prophet Daniel in Babylon, over 400 years earlier. He likely learned of Daniel’s prophecy (Daniel 9:25), which predicted the exact day of the Messiah’s coming as King in Jerusalem. This prophecy was fulfilled on Palm Sunday in 30/32 AD, when Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey’s foal, celebrated by the people as the Messiah, three days before His crucifixion.

Thus, the Magi, about 30 years earlier, could have anticipated the birth of this Messiah, and they correctly interpreted the appearance of a new star in the womb of the constellation of the Virgin (now Coma Berenices) above Jerusalem as the fulfillment of the Protoevangelium: In Judea, the Messiah promised since ancient times must have been born. In early December of that birth year, they arrived in Jerusalem and traveled to Bethlehem at night. When the star

stood directly at its zenith (“stood still”), they were before the house where Jesus was now living. A legend mentions in passing that they saw the star reflected in a well, meaning it must have been directly at its zenith, around 6:45 AM, just before sunrise.

The Mission of the Savior-King (Messiah) Jesus:

Messiah in Hebrew corresponds to the Greek Christos and means Anointed One, the King appointed and established by God.

When Jesus was about 30 years old, around 26 AD, His forerunner John the Baptist prepared the people for the Messiah-King with the following call:

“Repent, turn around, and change your thoughts and concepts, for the Kingdom of Heaven has come near!”

Shortly thereafter, Jesus began His public ministry with exactly the same words:

“Repent, turn around, and change your thoughts and concepts, worldviews,

priorities, and perverse ways of life, for the Kingdom of Heaven has come near!”

Jesus preached exclusively about the Kingdom of Heaven and the constitution and laws of God’s Kingdom. The Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5–7 can be regarded as the constitution of the Kingdom of Heaven. In its preamble, Jesus made it abundantly clear that He did not come to abolish God’s law but to fulfill it.

Jesus left no doubt that, as the Son of Man, He is the King of this Kingdom of Heaven and was in constant connection with His heavenly Father in everything He said and did.

Jesus demonstrated the authority and power of the Kingdom by performing signs and wonders, healing all the sick brought to Him, casting out demons, and raising the dead.

Jesus showed all people that He was fully dependent on the Father and obedient to the Father in Heaven, even unto death.

Jesus demonstrated that He had mastery over all circumstances, and the

circumstances did not control Him.

He commanded the water, the wind, and the trees, and they obeyed Him. He escaped assassination attempts by simply walking through the midst of angry crowds and leaving. Jesus was, of course, never sick.

Jesus showed that sickness is illegal in the Kingdom of Heaven.

Jesus would never have fallen for a pandemic or virus lie, would never have been vaccinated, and would never have worn a mask. Hypocrisy is the Aramaic word for face-mask.

As the Son of Man, Jesus reclaimed dominion over the earth and executed the will of the Father and King in Heaven 100% on earth.

Jesus was without the original sin of rebellion and without any sins. **The devil had no claim on Him, nothing.**

Thus, Jesus crushed the serpent's head through His sinless life in constant fellowship with the heavenly government, and as a true human, He legally regained dominion over the earth and all

circumstances. Wherever Jesus the King was, the reality of the Kingdom of Heaven and its authority were present. (Point 1).

But what good was it for humans if only one man, the Son of God who became flesh like us but without sin, **had mastery over circumstances?**

Jesus, as a human and King, could not be everywhere to heal people and free them from the power of darkness. **Jesus was the only human reconciled with God and in constant connection with the Father.** He gave His disciples authority and sent them ahead into the villages to preach the gospel of the Kingdom of God and heal the sick, but this was not enough. The disciples could not yet be entrusted with everything because they lacked two things: They had not yet received the **new divine life through the Spirit.** They had not yet received **the authority of the Holy Spirit.** Jesus told His disciples shortly before His crucifixion that it was good for Him to go, because He would then

send the Holy Spirit—a multiplication of the Messiah, so to speak.

The Ultra-Radical Work of Redemption of the Savior-King at the Cross:

Jesus made it clear that, as a human, He did not come to judge but to save. The fallen man was still trapped in a corrupt, rebellious nature. He was not reconciled with God.

Therefore, Jesus died on the cross voluntarily, as a substitute for the whole world. His blood was shed for the forgiveness of our guilt and rebellion and for all our sins, lawlessness, and transgressions committed in independence and rebellion. God placed the punishment we deserved on Jesus. This paid our debt, secured justification, and made atonement possible. The barrier between God and man caused by sin was broken down in the Body of the Messiah on the cross when He died. When Jesus died, the veil in the temple to the Holy of Holies was

torn from top to bottom. Access to the Father in Heaven was made possible again through the blood of Jesus. (Point 2).

The Resurrection of Jesus from the Dead: satan did not realize that Jesus would rise from the dead, even though Jesus had repeatedly foretold this to His disciples. Since Jesus was without His own sin but took our sins upon Himself, death could not hold Him. What no one could foresee, especially not the devil, and what **was a strict secret of God the Father and the Son, then happened: Through the resurrection, Jesus, who died as the “last Adam,” became the “firstborn from the dead” and became the Spirit who gives life. 1 Corinthians 15:45.**

Immediately after Jesus rose from the dead and appeared to the disciples, He breathed on them and said:

“Receive the Holy Spirit.”

With this, they received the divine life that was lost at the Fall, the constant connection and union of the human spirit with God's Spirit. Now the disciples, as humans in the body on earth, once again **had simultaneous contact in the spirit with God the King in Heaven. The divine, eternal, indestructible life entered their spirit through the Holy Spirit. They were born anew, from above, from God. Man became a new creation, a new man.**

Then Jesus, the man, ascended to Heaven and sat at the right hand of the Father on the throne, reigning until all His enemies are made a footstool for His feet. (Romans 16:20; 1 Corinthians 15:25) Jesus was raised from the dead by the Holy Spirit and, as a man, now reigns in Heaven.

Then, **at Pentecost, the Holy Spirit was poured out** on the 120 gathered believers. They were equipped with the purity, boldness, and **power of the Holy Spirit** and baptized with

tongues of fire.

The Holy Spirit is the governor of the Kingdom of Heaven in all believers on earth. The Holy Spirit makes all believers the Body of the Messiah on earth.

Through the Holy Spirit in believers, God has once again entrusted dominion and legal authority over the earth to humans who are born, ruled, and led by the Holy Spirit.

God has placed the Savior-King Jesus above all power and authority and has put everything under His feet, and God has made the Messiah the head of the congregation (Ekklesia). The assembly of believers is the Body of Christ. And the congregation of believers is filled with the fullness of God and carries out God's governmental affairs on earth.

Thus, through believers filled with the Holy Spirit as the Body of the Messiah-King, God has created a new humanity that represents the Kingdom of God on earth.

This new man possesses **the divine nature** and daily crucifies the old, corrupt nature (flesh) of the fallen old man. (Point 3).

Something Else Crucial Was Accomplished Through Jesus' Death on the Cross:

As the “**last Adam,**” **Jesus,** by legally paying the penalty for the entire guilt of fallen humanity through **His blood, crucified, buried, and ended this old, corrupt man with Himself.**

Therefore, since Jesus' resurrection from the dead, no human outside the Messiah has a right to exist or any relevance.

This is the radical nature of Jesus' redemptive work on the cross: Your old, independent man was ended by Jesus, as He died as the last Adam.

Everyone who rejects King Jesus is illegally on the earth, and it is only a matter of time before they ultimately disappear.

Every knee must bow and confess that Jesus is

King. Better to do so voluntarily than to be forced too late! **We are currently in a transitional period, a time of grace or grace period, to give all people the opportunity to turn to Jesus.** Therefore, we call out to all people:

Be reconciled with God by believing in the One whom God sent for reconciliation, salvation, and the restoration of dominion: The Messiah-King Jesus.

Jesus says unequivocally: If someone is not born anew by God's Spirit, he cannot enter the Kingdom of Heaven. That which is born of the flesh is flesh; that which is born of the Spirit is spirit.

We are now in the phase of the final establishment of the Kingdom of God on earth, **where this gospel of the Kingdom of Heaven is preached to all nations**, and thus all powers that resist King Jesus are gradually crushed. We do not fight against flesh and blood but against the powers of darkness in the spiritual realm, which still keep people in deception and

ignorance. **The truth sets free.**

Something Else Important Was Ended Through the Death on the Cross:

After the fall of man, **God cursed the serpent to eat the dust of adama (earth).** The fallen man thus became, so to speak, the existential basis for satan.

Now Jesus ended the old, fallen man with Himself on the cross, thereby depriving satan of his lifeline. By seducing man into rebellion, satan fell into a trap from which he can never escape.

How Do You Concretely Become a Citizen of the Kingdom of Heaven Today and Now?

If you want to be rescued from the kingdom of darkness into the Kingdom of Light and of God's beloved Son, you must do the following:

Repent, which means:

Turn back to God from independence from

God, into complete submission to King Jesus, His rules, His laws, and His Word, and into complete dependence on the Holy Spirit.

Renew your mind: From now on, daily renew your thoughts based on God's Word and truth, and focus on the Kingdom of God on earth.

Sincerely ask the Holy Spirit for conviction of sin: Then confess and repent of all recognized sins, especially the rebellion of your previous selfish, independent life, but also all other sins, such as ingratitude, lying, stealing, immorality, adultery, fornication, impurity, idolatry, occultism, superstition, witchcraft = pharmacy, drugs, addictions, disobedience, cursing, unteachability, ignorance, greed, jealousy, envy, hatred, strife, anger, vanity, gossip, pride, arrogance, taking God's name in vain, self-centeredness, unbelief, conflict, pornography, murder (e.g., abortion), homosexuality, perversion of any kind, lust of the flesh, lust of the eyes, covetousness, cowardice, betrayal, laziness, freeloading, dishonoring parents, etc.

Now ask Jesus for forgiveness of your rebellion and the sins you have confessed.

Baptism: Then you must be baptized in water by believers who agree with this gospel. This can be done in a bathtub and should not be done in bikinis. God is holy. Through baptism, you testify before humans, angels, and the kingdom of darkness that you have buried your old life without God with Christ on the cross. When you come up from the water, you testify: I am a new man, for the Holy Spirit has planted the seed of the new, holy, divine life in my spirit. I have been born of God through the resurrection of Jesus and have received citizenship in the Kingdom of Heaven.

Then ask Jesus for the baptism with the Holy Spirit and with fire and for His spiritual gifts. In the name of Jesus, receive the Holy Spirit now!

If you are sick, raise your hands now, if you can, and receive complete healing and health in the name of Jesus. Sickness is illegal in the Kingdom of God!

The Blood of Jesus Accomplishes the Following When You Claim It.

It Is the Strongest Power in the Universe:

1. Through the blood of Jesus, **you are bought out of the power of satan's darkness and rescued into the Kingdom of God's Son.**
2. Through the blood of Jesus, **you have forgiveness for the sins** you have confessed.
3. Through the blood of Jesus, your guilty **conscience is cleansed**, only through the blood.
4. Through the blood of Jesus, **you have justification before God**, as if you had never sinned.
5. Through the blood of Jesus, **you are sanctified for God, set apart for God's purpose and intention.**
6. Through the blood of Jesus, **you are in the New Covenant/Testament**, sealed with the blood of Jesus. **You have a claim to all the blessings of the New Covenant** with God through Jesus and His blood.

Now you are in the reception hall of the Kingdom of God. You can immediately begin to babble in a new language so that your newly born spirit starts implementing God's thoughts into your life. To do this, simply open your mouth and babble like a baby. Over time, it may sound like a foreign language. Do this several times daily.

Then start reading the manual and constitution of the Kingdom of Heaven: the Bible. Use multiple translations for this. At jesus4you.ch, a new translation is being developed based on the Aramaic source texts, the language of Jesus. The AENTJ Study Bible, convenient to read or have read aloud on your phone, includes many comments for a deep, contemporary understanding. Most previous Bible translations for the New Testament are based on Greek manuscripts. The extensive agreement between the texts in these two ancient languages after 2,000 years proves how unadulterated the words of King Jesus have been transmitted and preserved and how accurately they were

translated. Only a few obvious translation errors exist. Read the Bible together with the Holy Spirit. The letter kills, but the Spirit gives life.

Talk to the Holy Spirit all day and at night when you are awake, about everything.

Cast all your cares on God; from now on, as King, He takes care of you—it's a matter of honor. You are now a newly born royal child. Expect great things from God for your life and seek His will and plan for your life. What is your role in the Kingdom of Heaven? Have great respect and reverence for God.

Deny yourself daily, crucify your flesh along with its lusts and desires.

Seek **daily** fellowship with like-minded citizens of the Kingdom of God who affirm this gospel. If you have no one, write to us. Perhaps something can be arranged via Telegram.

Warning: Be careful: many Christian churches and congregations contain elements of the Kingdom of Heaven and the fundamental truths regarding salvation through the cross. However, instead of being governmental assemblies of the

Kingdom of Heaven and the true Body of the Messiah in the Holy Spirit, many Christian churches have turned it into a religion and are divided and mixed with Babylonian cult. The word “church” does not appear in the New Testament; it comes from kyriakon (house of the Lord), referring to houses of worship **made of stone** (or wood). **The New Testament makes it clear that God no longer builds a temple of stones and that the assembly of the saints is a spiritual building with humans as living stones. This builds the spiritual temple of the Holy Spirit,** so that God maintains a kingdom of priests on earth to carry out divine governmental affairs and make all enemies a footstool for His feet.
